This Annual Awards Ceremony & Luncheon is being held at the historic Oval Cricket Ground on Friday 29 October, where we can relive some outstanding achievements of the 2019 Season. *(We will also be presenting – Yes, some cricket did take place! – the odd award or three for the 2020 Season).*

Our Guest Speaker for the day is former Middlesex and England Spin Bowler, John Emburey.

Members of the Presidential Team, including John Barclay, Vic Marks, Sir Tim Rice and Charlotte Edwards will all be in attendance.

We will be presenting two Wetherell Awards (including the Leading First Class All Rounder, Ryan Higgins), the Don Rowan Memorial Trophy (for the College / School in the Surrey CCC catchment area that has done most to promote a love of cricket), the Ian Jackson Award (Enid Bakewell), the Most Promising Young Male Cricketer (Zac Crawley), the Most Promising Young Female Cricketer (Freya Davies), the AA Thompson Fielding Prize, the Sir John Hobbs Silver Jubilee Memorial Prize, and the Perry-Lewis / Kershaw Memorial Trophy (to The Society XI Player of the Year) for both the 2019 and 2020 seasons. **In 2019 we introduced a new Award – The Charlotte Edwards Award for the Most Outstanding Schoolgirl Cricketer in England.**

Three further awards are also being presented: **The Cricket Society's Best Newcomer in First Class Cricket Award for Performances in The Bob Willis Trophy.** 2020 Winner (Tom Lammonby). **The Cricket Society's Best Newcomer in the Rachael Heyhoe Flint Trophy.** 2020 Winner (Charlotte Taylor). **The Howard Milton Award for Cricket Scholarship (in association with the British Society of Sports History)** 2020 Winner (The Sussex Cricket Museum).

Why not try to put Covid behind us by dusting off your second-best bib and tucker and tip up. Coerce as many of your cricketing luminaries (your mates) as possible to attend and enjoy an afternoon of merriment.
